Who Are You?

If you were a businessman . . .

You may have been a freed slave or a free born Roman citizen.

- Archaeologists found a seal ring bearing the name "Lucius Crassius Tertius" in Oplontis B. Seal rings were used in place of written signatures. Was he the manager of Villa B? We may never know for sure.
- The owner of Oplontis B may have been involved in the wine trade. Over 1200 amphorae (some with wine residue) were found in this courtyard to the right. The strongbox probably held money and records from your business— signs of the owner's wealth.

 One of the skeletons found here was carrying a great deal of money and jewelry. Some scholars have suggested that she was the owner of Oplontis B. Women could own their own villas and businesses.
